How we are doing this?

Each of the 'Safer' Groups undertakes a wide range of work in Bromsgrove, Redditch and Wyre Forest. Some initiatives are specific to each area, but wherever possible we work together.

Initiatives across the three areas include:

Home Security

Our schemes aim to reduce burglary and to improve resident's feelings of safety in their home.

Domestic Abuse

Every year we support the 16 Days of Action and White Ribbon campaigns. We raise awareness of domestic abuse, advising people how to report and about the help available.

Safe and Sound

Each month we have a column in our local newspapers. It's important to us to provide advice and information.

What is the North Worcestershire Community Safety Partnership?

Formed in April 2013, the North Worcestershire Community Safety Partnership (NWCSP) brings together and replaces the original Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs) in Bromsgrove, Redditch and Wyre Forest, which had been in place since 1998 as a result of the Crime and Disorder Act.

The Partnership provides a co-ordinated approach to tackling crime and anti-social behaviour (ASB) and works with agencies and communities to address local community safety issues and achieve the Partnership's vision of keeping "North Worcestershire a safer place to live, work and visit".

NWCSP Board

This group meets every three months, to provide a strategic focus for the Partnership. It bids for and allocates funding and ensures projects are delivered. This group is also represented at a number of countywide and regional forums.

Tasking Groups

These are known as Safer Bromsgrove, Safer Redditch and Safer Wyre Forest. They are responsible for delivering the actions in the Partnership Plan. They work together with local organisations to develop and deliver community safety initiatives.

North Worcestershire Hate Incident Partnership

The group aims to tackle all forms of hate crime and targeted harassment across North Worcestershire and to support people to report incidents.

Vulnerable Adults Groups

Two groups operate across North Worcestershire. They are responsible for delivering activities that affect the most vulnerable people in our communities.

Crime Data Analysis

The partnership uses data from a variety of sources to help identify trends and emerging issues. The data ensures that the partnership concentrates its work on areas of most concern.

Our Priorities

Anti Social Behaviour

To continue to reduce the number of anti social behaviour incidents and to bring perceptions in line with the downward trend in reported incidents.

Preventing Violence and Abuse

To ensure residents are safe and feel safe in the community and at home without having to suffer violence, domestic abuse or hate.

Burglary

Promoting home security to further reduce incidences of dwelling and non-dwelling burglary and to improve residents' feelings of safety in their home.

Reducing Re-offending

To tackle and increase our understanding of reoffending in North Worcestershire with continued support of the Integrated Offender Management approach.
